

VOTE AT HOME

The World Health Organization has declared COVID-19 a pandemic, President Donald Trump has declared COVID-19 a national emergency and Governor Kim Reynolds has signed a Proclamation of Disaster Emergency amid COVID-19 cases in Iowa. With that in mind, the Woodbury County Auditor's Office has made the decision to conduct the April 14, 2020 special election to fill a vacancy on the Woodbury County Board of Supervisors essentially as a vote by mail election.

We are encouraging all Woodbury County voters to request an absentee ballot and to cast their ballot in the comfort and security of their own homes. We ask that you protect yourself and our Precinct Election Officials by simply completing the postage paid Absentee Ballot Request Form and returning it ASAP (**a request form must be received in our office by 5:00 p.m. on April 3rd**) so that we may send a ballot to you to be voted and returned to us postage paid. To be counted, the ballot must be postmarked by April 13th or hand delivered to our office by 9:00 p.m. on Election Day.

There will only be two vote centers open in Woodbury County on April 14th from 7:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m., the day of the election. One will be located at Augustana Lutheran Church located near downtown Sioux City at 600 Court St. and the other will be located at the Woodbury County Public Safety Building located at 121 Deer Run Trail in Climbing Hill. We also will be open for early-in-person voting in our office from 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Monday through Friday until the day before the election. We are asking that you refrain from using these facilities unless you are unregistered or have some other voter registration issue.
